Report and Thank Yous for the memorial to the Basque Children at Town Quay Park, Southampton. Saturday 22 October 2022

Last Saturday 22nd October 2022 in Southampton a memorial plaque and sculpture dedicated to the Basque Children who arrived there 85 years ago and the volunteers who supported them were unveiled. This was organised by BCA'37 UK and the Friends of Town Quay Park. The park is the closest park to the Port of Southampton where the *SS Habana* which had travelled from Bilbao disembarked the 4,000 passengers who were refugees from the Spanish Civil War 1936 to 1937 - the children, the teachers, the auxiliaries and the priests. The two ends of the children's journey to safety are now marked by memorials. The departure point at the Santurtxi port of Bilbao and the arrival point at Town Quay port of Southampton now mark this journey.

The event on Saturday 22nd October 2022 was attended by two of the children Paulina and Josefina, by their families, by the 9 families of 32 of the other 3862 children.
